Sub: Establishment of new medical college in the name and style of Maharishi Markandeshwar Instt. of Medical Sciences & Research, at Mullana, Ambala - permission of Central Government - regarding

Sir,

I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letter of even number dated 30th September, 2003 whereby a Letter of Permission was granted to your Trust for establishment of a new medical college in the name and style of Maharishi Markandeshwar Instt. of Medical Sciences & Research, at Mullana, Ambala for the academic session 2003-04 with an annual intake capacity of 100 (one hundred only) students, as against 150 intake capacity recommended by the MCI based on the report of a team of Inspectors appointed by the Government to assess the facilities available in the above college. In the meanwhile, on the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh, in Writ petition No.21504 of 2003 dated 10.11.2003 in respect of two similarly placed colleges in Andhra Pradesh where the permission was granted by the Government for 100 admissions as against the recommendation made by MCI for 150 admissions, the Government decided to conduct an inspection for ascertaining the facilities developed by the said colleges for grant of Letter of Permission for full strength of 150 students. Subsequently, the Government also received a representation from your Trust claiming the availability of all the requisite facilities vis-à-vis the MCI regulations for the full strength of admission of 150 students. In view of the decision taken in respect of the similarly placed colleges in Andhra Pradesh, it was decided to conduct another inspection of your college for verification of the availability of requisite facilities for the full strength of 150 students. Accordingly, a team of Inspectors was appointed by the Central Government for this purpose which conducted the inspection of your Institute on 1st May, 2004.

The Central Government, after taking into consideration the report of the inspection conducted on 1.5.2004, have decided that the letter of permission issued vide this Ministry's letter of even number dated 30.9.2003 to your Trust for establishment of the above mentioned

medical college, may be modified for grant of 150 admissions instead of 100 admissions granted for the academic session 2003-04. However, as the last date for admission of students fixed by the MCI in pursuance of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Madhu Singh case for the academic session 2003-04 has expired on 30.9.2003, no further admissions shall be possible against the modified letter of permission for 150 seats for 2003-04. The college, however, will be eligible to be considered for the first renewal for admission of 2nd batch of students with an admission capacity of 150 seats for which the Institute may apply to the Medical Council of India. The other terms and conditions for grant of Letter of Permission indicated in this Ministry's letter of even number dated 30.9.2003 shall remain the same.
